GERMANY: JEWISH MUSEUM A TARGET

Islamic extremists in a group called Al Tawhid were planning attacks on Jewish targets in Düsseldorf and on the Jewish Museum in Berlin, a terror suspect, Shadi Mohd Mustafa Abdellah, said at his trial in Düsseldorf. The 26-year-old Jordanian of Palestinian origin testified that he worked in a cell of four and was responsible for procuring weapons. He admitted training with Al Qaeda and claimed to have been Osama bin Laden's bodyguard for a time. But he said there were no operational links between that group and his.
