

## IVORY COAST: RED CROSS WORKERS SLAIN

The bodies of four Red Cross workers who have been missing since mid-January have been found in the volatile western town of Toulepleu, near the Liberian border, the organization said. The volunteers had been abducted by armed men, the International Committee of the Red Cross said in a statement, without indicating whether rebels or government loyalists were responsible. People on the Liberia-Ivory Coast frontier are said to be in dire straits, but it is next to impossible for aid workers to function there. Three aid workers with an agency based in the United States were killed on the other side of the Liberian border three weeks ago.
