The authorities freed three top Maoist rebels in an effort to revive stalled peace talks intended to end an increasingly violent revolt. The move came a day after the Maoists, fighting to replace the constitutional monarchy with a communist republic, gave the government until Thursday to fulfill five demands to resume the talks, stalled since May, including the release of the three rebels.
